

Who is responsible for agrivoltaics in France?

(Author of an ADEME report on agrivoltaics, ADEME interview, September 2022.) The CRE--and by extension the French Ministry of Ecology and, particularly, the Directorate General for Energy and Climate (DGEC)--are the key players in the development and framing of the agrivoltaic sector in France.

What is France agrivoltaisme?

In June 2021, French solar companies Sun'Agri, REM Tec, Kilowattsol, and Altergie Développement et Râcines announced the creation of France Agrivoltaisme, the world's first trade body for the agrivoltaics sector. This content is protected by copyright and may not be reused.

What does agrivoltaics mean in French politics?

In 2017, the term 'agrivoltaics' officially entered French politics. It appears within the CRE's calls for tenders, which are restructured to correspond to the objectives of the Programmation Pluriannuelle de l'Énergie (PPE). Policies to support agrivoltaics are mainly implemented through one of the calls for tenders issued by the CRE.

What is agrivoltaics?

The AO Innovation provides a regulatory definition of agrivoltaics for the first time (ADEME et al., 2021); this is defined as an installation that allows 'to couple secondary photovoltaic production with main agricultural production, enabling demonstrable operating synergy' (CRE, 2017).

What is the regulatory framework for agrivoltaics?

The regulatory framework for agrivoltaics has its origins in the development of photovoltaics. At the end of the 2000s, the rapid growth of photovoltaics, driven by the attractiveness of feed-in tariffs from 2008 (Debourdeau, 2011), led to fears of widespread conversion of agricultural land into solar power plants.

How to control the development of agrivoltaics?

Many departmental and regional Chambers of Agriculture have drawn up documents to ensure the controlled development of agrivoltaics, taking various forms (motions, doctrines, deliberations, charters, regional frameworks, etc.) on the subject of photovoltaics or specifically agrivoltaics.
