

Will Angola get more electricity?

Angola - sub-Saharan Africa's third-largest economy, a major oil exporter and OPEC member - has placed increased access to electricity as a top national priority, targeting 9.9 GW of installed generation capacity and a 60% electrification rate by 2025.

How has Angola's energy transition changed over the years?

However, large-scale projects implemented since 2017/18 have contributed greatly to Angola's energy transition. The Soyo combined-cycle natural gas plant and the Laúca hydroelectric power project have added 750 MW and 2.1 GW, respectively, towards diversification of the country's energy matrix.

What are the options for power generation in Angola?

Angola has numerous options for the generation of power. The present document considers the key options - hydro, thermal and new renewable - individually and combined in scenarios that meet the required levels of safety and redundancy.

How much power does Angola need?

In order to ensure a safe power supply, even in years of lower hydro flow, Angola should have 9.9 GW of installed capacity - through increasing power capacity in all sub-systems and through a strong reliance on hydro and gas (which will correspond, respectively, to 66% and 19% of installed power capacity).

What is Angola's energy vision for 2025?

The Government of Angola has implemented an Energy 2025 Vision plan, a comprehensive framework for the expansion of the country's electrification rate to 60% and the increase in installed capacity to 9.9 GW by 2025, using 66% water sources, 19% natural gas, eight percent renewable energies and seven percent thermal energy.

How did the AfDB support Angola's energy sector reforms?
