

How much energy does Bosnia and Herzegovina use?

Consumption or use of energy in Bosnia and Herzegovina (B&H) is unknown, although data on the annual consumption of about 140 PJ can be found. Although this sounds unbelievable at first, the energy balances that are produced on an annual basis confirm that fact.

Is Bosnia and Herzegovina a net exporter of electricity?

Bosnia and Herzegovina (BiH), a country of around 3.5 million people, is currently a net exporter of electricity - the only one in the Western Balkans. More than half of its electricity generation capacity is made up of hydropower, while the remainder is made up of five lignite power plants.

The first grid-connected solar power system in Bosnia and Herzegovina was put into operation on 19/03/2012. The system can be housed on the roof of a gym in Kalesija, just outside of Tuzla. The system model is presented in Fig. 6, while the real situation is presented in Fig. 7. The photovoltaic system is directly linked to the electrical grid.
