What are thermal energy storage strategies?

There are two basic Thermal Energy Storage (TES) Strategies, latent heat systems and sensible heat systems. Stratification is used within the tank as a strategy for thermal layering of the stored water. Colder water is denser and will settle toward the bottom of the tank, while the warmer water will naturally seek to rise to the top.

What is tank thermal energy storage?

Tank thermal energy storage (TTES) are often made from concrete and with a thin plate welded-steel liner inside. The type has primarily been implemented in Germany in solar district heating systems with 50% or more solar fraction. Storage sizes have been up to 12,000 m 3 (Figure 9.23). Figure 9.23. How does natural stratification occur in tank thermal energy storage?

Natural stratification occurs in tank thermal energy storage due to the different densities of water at different temperatures; hot water flows towards the top while cold water remains at the bottom, called thermal stratification.

By contrast, in a thermal storage system, domestic hot water (DHW) is provided via a heat exchanger. Cold water from the mains enters the coil at the top of the tank and is heated by ...
