Store in a cool, dark place away from sunlight and strong odors. Don't store near heat sources, in the refrigerator or freezer, or in brightly lit areas. Choose a container size that fits the amount of tea you have. This limits the ...

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No, storing most tea in the refrigerator will actually expose it to moisture and condensation, thereby reducing the shelf life! It's better to just store your tea in a cool, dry place like a cabinet away from appliances like stoves or ovens. The ...

Can the refrigerator store tea leaves

Do not put tea in the refrigerator. Never store tea in your refrigerator. The refrigerator will not help tea keep longer and the moisture can damage your tea. Remember, loose leaf tea holds up best when it's stored at ...
