How many people have access to electricity in Central African Republic?

Less than 3% of the population has access to electricity in Central African Republic. Grid-based electricity supply is insufficient to meet electricity demand: it is unavailable 28% of the year on average, mainly due to generation outages.

Did Central African Republic import electricity?

Central African Republic did not import electricity. Power generation, which includes electricity and heat, is one of the largest sources of CO<sub>2</sub> emissions globally, primarily from the burning of fossil fuels like coal and natural gas in thermal power plants.

Is Central African Republic a poor country?

Landlocked in the heart of Africa; Central African Republic (CAR); has very low urbanization level (40%), and one of the poorest and most fragile countries which scored 188th out of 189 countries by the 2020 UNH Development Index with a low national installed capacity of 41.20 MW and only 32.40% access rate mainly in the capital.
