

Who fought on Christmas Island?

Opposing this invasion force was a single 6 in (150 mm) gun that had been built in 1900 and had been mounted on Christmas Island in 1940. The British garrison--a detachment of the Hong Kong and Singapore Royal Artillery--numbered 32 troops. It was led by a British officer,Captain L. W. T. Williams.

What happened at Christmas Island?

The East Point balloon anchor on Christmas Island. The bombs for Grapple Z1 and Z4 were hoisted by balloons from here. Of particular concern was radiation damage. Did the United States use Christmas Island for nuclear testing?

In addition to the British tests during Operation Grapple,the United States used Christmas Island for nuclear testing in Operation Dominic in 1962. Twenty-four nuclear bombs were detonated near Christmas Island as part of this test series. [160 ]
