

Madagascar has the largest clean cooking deficit in Africa, with less than 1 percent of households using clean fuels, and a fraction of a percent of households using improved wood or charcoal stoves. For closing the access gap in Madagascar USD 2.3 billion is required for off-grid electricity and improved cooking solutions.
