

Where can I get a master's degree in energy systems?

The Master of Science in Energy Systems program at Northeastern University's College of Engineering can be taken completely online, or completely on campus. This Master's degree requires 35.5 credit hours for graduation. The focus of this degree is on public planning, technical principles, and business strategies.

How many credits does an online degree in energy & sustainability policy take?

The online Bachelor of Arts degree in Energy and Sustainability Policy program is no exception. The comprehensive curriculum, designed by an advisory board of energy industry experts and Penn State faculty members, requires a total of 120 credits for graduation.

Does um offer a Master of Engineering & Energy Systems?

The Energy Institute at UM offers the Master of Engineering and Energy Systems, and the Master of Engineering Sustainable Systems. The Master of Engineering and Energy Systems is the first in the nation, and is designed to teach engineers to handle changing energy needs on a global scale.

Does Arizona State University offer a BS in sustainability?

Arizona State University (ASU) offers an online BS in Sustainability, and an online BA in Business Sustainability. The BS in Business Sustainability teaches graduates to enter the workforce and ensure that businesses are in keeping with sustainable practices.
