One study suggests that tourism revitalizes endangered destinations and significantly contributes to the sustainability of cultural heritage. Rasoolimanesh et al. found that communities living in cultural heritage areas develop a stronger sense of identity and belonging, positively impacting the sustainability of an area.

The development of tourism poses significant threats, particularly to the preservation of cultural heritage. In this respect, the strong relationship between cultural heritage preservation and sustainability has attracted the attention of academic research.
