#### Where is Denmark located?

Along with Norway and Sweden, Denmark is a part of the northern European region known as Scandinavia. The country's capital, Copenhagen (Kø benhavn), is located primarily on Zealand; the second largest city,Århus,is the major urban center of Jutland.

#### What is the capital of Denmark?

A small village existed on the site of the present city by the early 10th century. In 1445 Copenhagen was made the capital of Denmark and the residence of the royal family.

#### How do you spell C in Danish?

Many words originally derived from Latin roots retain ?c? in their Danish spelling, for example Norwegian sentrum vs Danish centrum. The "foreign" letters also sometimes appear in the spelling of otherwise-indigenous family names. For example, many of the Danish families that use the surname Skov (meaning 'forest') spell it Schou.

#### Where is Copenhagen located?

Geologically, Copenhagen lies in the northern part of Denmarkwhere the land is rising because of post-glacial rebound. Amager Strandpark, which opened in 2005, is a 2 km (1 mi) long artificial island, with a total of 4.6 km (2.9 mi) of beaches. It is located just 15 minutes by bicycle or a few minutes by metro from the city centre. [70]

#### What is Denmark known for?

Denmark and its multiple outlying islands have a wide range of folk traditions. The country's most famous classical composer is Carl Nielsen (1865-1931), especially remembered for his six symphonies and his Wind Quintet, while the Royal Danish Ballet specialises in the work of the Danish choreographer August Bournonville.

#### Which Danish media companies are located in Copenhagen?

Many Danish media corporations are located in Copenhagen. DR, the major Danish public service broadcasting corporation consolidated its activities in a new headquarters, DR Byen, in 2006 and 2007.
