Can nanomaterials improve the performance of energy storage devices?

The development of nanomaterials and their related processing into electrodes and devices can improve the performanceand/or development of the existing energy storage systems. We provide a perspective on recent progress in the application of nanomaterials in energy storage devices, such as supercapacitors and batteries.

What are the limitations of nanomaterials in energy storage devices?

The limitations of nanomaterials in energy storage devices are related to their high surface area--which causes parasitic reactions with the electrolyte, especially during the first cycle, known as the first cycle irreversibility--as well as their agglomeration.

Which nanomaterials are used in energy storage?

Although the number of studies of various phenomena related to the performance of nanomaterials in energy storage is increasing year by year, only a few of them--such as graphene sheets, carbon nanotubes (CNTs), carbon black, and silicon nanoparticles--are currently used in commercial devices, primarily as additives (18).

The application of carbon-based nanomaterials in energy storage devices has gained significant attention in the past decade. Efforts have been made to improve the electrochemical performance and cyclic stability by modifying existing electrode materials.

Can inorganic nanomaterials drive innovation?
