What are the different types of thermal energy storage systems?

Thermal energy storage (TES) systems store heat or cold for later use and are classified into sensible heat storage, latent heat storage, and thermochemical heat storage. Sensible heat storage systems raise the temperature of a material to store heat. Latent heat storage systems use PCMs to store heat through melting or solidifying.

What are some sources of thermal energy for storage?

Other sources of thermal energy for storage include heat or cold produced with heat pumps from off-peak, lower cost electric power, a practice called peak shaving; heat from combined heat and power (CHP) power plants; heat produced by renewable electrical energy that exceeds grid demand and waste heat from industrial processes.

Can thermal energy be stored in a heat storage media?

Thermal energy (i.e. heat and cold) can be stored as sensible heat in heat storage media, as latent heat associated with phase change materials (PCMs) or as thermo-chemical energy associated with chemical reactions (i.e. thermo-chemical storage) at operation temperatures ranging from -40°C to above 400°C.

What is the difference between amount of stored heat and temperature?

The amount of stored heat is the function of the mass of storage material and its specific heat as well as the temperature change as follows: where Q is the amount of stored energy, m is the mass of storage medium, and C_p is the specific heat, while T_i and T_f are the initial and final temperature, respectively.

What are the benefits of thermal energy storage?

Potential and Barriers - The storage of thermal energy (typically from renewable energy sources, waste heat or surplus energy production) can replace heat and cold production from fossil fuels, reduce CO₂ emissions and lower the need for costly peak power and heat production capacity.

What is thermochemical heat storage?

Thermochemical heat storage is one effective type of thermal energy storage technique, which allows significant TES capacities per weight of materials used. In the NHS project, reversible chemical reactions (absorption and desorption) between metal halides and ammonia (NH₃) are used.
