What is the energy storage roadmap?

First established in 2020 and founded on EPRI's mission of advancing safe, reliable, affordable, and clean energy for society, the Energy Storage Roadmap envisioned a desired future for energy storage applications and industry practices in 2025 and identified the challenges in realizing that vision.

What are battery energy storage systems?

In contrast to other technologies with more specific use cases, batteries are able to provide a broad range of services to the electricity system. Accordingly, battery energy storage systems are the fastest growing storage technology today, and their deployment is projected to increase rapidly in all three scenarios.

When will large-scale battery energy storage systems come online?

Most large-scale battery energy storage systems we expect to come online in the United States over the next three years are to be built at power plants that also produce electricity from solar photovoltaics, a change in trend from recent years.

What is behind the meter battery energy storage system?

Behind-the-meter battery energy storage systems are connected to the distribution grid behind the utility meter of an individual electricity consumer, typically a household or a small business. Behind-the-meter battery energy storage systems are usually paired with a distributed energy resource, in most cases rooftop solar PV.

How does battery storage compare to generation-only technology?

Unlike other energy sources, battery storage can supply and consume energy at different times of the day, creating a combination of cost and revenue streams that makes it challenging to directly compare storage with generation-only technologies.

What types of stationary energy storage are covered in the roadmap?

Besides this classification, both centralized and decentralized stationary energy storage are covered in the roadmap. The specification $>100\text{kWh}$ is intended to cover energy storage up to a few MWh. The technology roadmap stationary energy storage 2030 due to be published in 2012 contains a more comprehensive classification.
