What is energy storage?

Energy storage is the capturing and holding of energy in reserve for later use. Energy storage solutions for electricity generation include pumped-hydro storage, batteries, flywheels, compressed-air energy storage, hydrogen storage and thermal energy storage components.

What are the different types of thermal energy storage systems?

Classification of thermal energy storage systems based on the energy storage material. Sensible liquid storage includes aquifer TES, hot water TES, gravel-water TES, cavern TES, and molten-salt TES. Sensible solid storage includes borehole TES and packed-bed TES.
