

Energy storage in high temperature environment

Why is thermal energy storage important?

For increasing the share of fluctuating renewable energy sources, thermal energy storages are undeniably important. Typical applications are heat and cold supply for buildings or in industries as well as in thermal power plants. Each application requires different storage temperatures.

What is sensitive heat storage?

Sensible heat storage is a mature technology. Different storage media (SM) are required for different temperature ranges. Water is used for temperatures up to 200 °C. For higher temperatures, SM in liquid state like thermal oil (up to 400 °C), molten salts (130-600 °C), or solid materials like rocks or ceramics (100-1300 °C) are considered.

What are the applications of thermochemical energy storage?

Numerous researchers published reviews and research studies on particular applications, including thermochemical energy storage for high temperature source and power generation [1, 2, 3], battery thermal management [4], textiles [31, 32], food, buildings [5, 6, 7], heating systems and solar power plants [8].

Why is energy storage important?

Energy storage under extreme conditions is limited by the material properties of electrolytes, electrodes, and their synergetic interactions, and thus significant opportunities exist for chemical advancements and technological improvements.

How does temperature affect energy storage performance?

However, leakage current and conduction loss significantly increase at elevated temperatures and highly applied electric fields and cause a sharp deteriorating energy storage performance and lifetime [15, 18].

Which dielectric has the best high-temperature energy storage characteristics?

On the basis of this base, ITIC is added to PI fiber to improve the high-temperature energy storage efficiency of the dielectric. The results showed that the composite dielectric with ITIC content of 0.25 vol% and PI content of 5 vol% has the best high-temperature energy storage characteristics.
