

How much energy does the pulp & paper industry use?

The production of paper and board is an energy intensive process. With an energy use of 6.4 EJ in 2005, the pulp and paper industry was responsible for about 6 % of the world's total industrial energy consumption (International Energy Agency (IEA) 2008), being the fourth largest industrial energy user worldwide.

What type of energy supply system does a pulp and paper mill use?

Fig. 1 presents a schematic diagram of the on-site energy supply system at a typical pulp and paper mill. The steam system consists of three pressure tiers: High Pressure (HP) steam; Medium Pressure (MP) steam; Low Pressure (LP) steam. Two boilers produce HP steam. The gas boiler follows the variation of steam demand.

How much energy can a pulp mill save?

The total theoretical savings potential for the integrated mill is 19 MW and for the market pulp mill 26 MW (i.e., around 10% of the minimum hot utility demand for the mills with conventional processes, which were 211 and 231 MW, respectively).

How much energy does a kraft pulp mill use?

This percentage makes more sense given that kraft pulping consumes around 4.4 GJ of steam and about 406 kWh e per ton of pulp. While chemical pulp mills require less external energy than mechanical pulps, these mills require about 2.2 tonnes of wood to manufacture one tonne of bleached kraft paper.

How much energy can a pulp & paper plant save?

Chiu Lin et al. reported potential energy savings of 211,694.4 MWh for 72 pulp and paper producers. The study identifies that the best approach for energy savings is to improve the facility steam systems. Yogan et al. report that improved process parameters can save around 8% steam. This is equivalent to US\$210,853 annually.

Can the pulp and paper industry be more environmentally sustainable?
