How is a rubber roller molded?

Once the core is shaped, a rubber coating is bonded to the surface typically using polymers and phenolic style resins. A solid rubber roller (without a steel core) will often be molded via either compression molding and injection molding. We recommend recoating and recovering to restore the roller surface.
