

How much power does Ethiopia have?

Ethiopia currently has approximately 4,500 MW of installed generation capacity. Ethiopia Electric Power (EEP), the state-owned power generation agency, is charged with maintaining more than fourteen hydropower and three wind power plants located in different parts of the country.

Why is energy important for Ethiopia?

Energy is one of the most significant sectors for Ethiopia's economic growth and development and is expected to increase significantly in the medium run. Ethiopia has abundant renewable energy resources and the potential to generate over 60,000 megawatts (MW) of electric power from hydroelectric, wind, solar, and geothermal sources.

How is Ethiopia generating electricity?

The Government of Ethiopia (GOE) has focused on the construction and expansion of power generating projects to deliver reliable electricity. Approximately 90% of the installed generation capacity is from hydropower while the remaining 8% and 2% is from wind and thermal sources, respectively.

Does Ethiopia have a power shortage?

Despite its energy potential, the country is experiencing energy shortages as it struggles to serve a population of over 110 million. Electricity demand is forecasted to grow by approximately 30% per year. Ethiopia currently has approximately 4,500 MW of installed generation capacity.

What is energy sector support in Ethiopia?

The focus of energy sector support in Ethiopia is aligned with Power Africa 2.0 objectives, which include advancing sustainable development through private sector led partnerships, promoting economic prosperity, and an increased focus on the enabling environment, transmission, and distribution.
