

Cuban authorities hope these investments will help ease the current crisis and ensure stable energy supplies in the future. Meanwhile, the island's residents must cope with daily difficulties due to the fuel shortage, which significantly affects their daily lives.

If in 2019 Cuba spent between 150 and 170 million dollars to buy fuel, in 2022 it was 1.7 billion, a figure that has continued to grow since then. This has happened, moreover, at a time when the island's income has fallen significantly in the midst of the deep economic and financial crisis it is experiencing.

The report highlights the issue that not only is Cuba's energy infrastructure in a precarious state of aging and disrepair, but also that its entire energy system relies heavily on external aid and imported fossil fuels.

This increases the damage to the generating plants and, therefore, the unsatisfied demand for parts and maintenance. Of the eight million tons of fuel that Cuba consumes, some five million depend on purchases on the international market, according to De La O Levy.

Cuba's relationships with other countries will be key to realizing the energy transition. Since 2000, Venezuela has been Cuba's primary source of imported oil. However, political and economic troubles in Venezuela caused oil exports to Cuba to fall by about half, resulting in Cuba increasingly seeking oil imports from Mexico and Russia.

Outlook for Renewable Energy Sources. The new decree aims to generate decentralized energy, reduce the burden on the state, and lower dependence on imported fuels. Since 2019, when the government issued Decree-Law No. 345 on "the development of renewable energy sources and efficient energy use," this policy has been a priority.

Renewable Energy In 2019, Cuba signed an agreement with the United Nations for Project 180087, committing to generate 29% of its energy from renewable sources by 2025. The project was scheduled to conclude on June 30, 2023, with a budget of \$3.4 million. The Cuban state forecasts generating 30,000 GWh by 2030, an almost unattainable goal.
