The energy stored in a capacitor can be expressed in three ways: $[E_{\text{cap}} = \frac{1}{2} QV = \frac{1}{2} CV^2 = \frac{Q^2}{2C}]$ where (Q) is the charge, (V) is the voltage, and (C) is the capacitance of the ...

The energy stored by a capacitor can be precisely calculated using the equation $E = \frac{1}{2} CV^2$, where E represents the stored energy, C the capacitance, and V the voltage across the capacitor.

Since the geometry of the capacitor has not been specified, this equation holds for any type of capacitor. The total work W needed to charge a capacitor is the electrical potential energy ...
