

Who is Hamilton Sundstrand power systems?

Hamilton Sundstrand Power Systems, also known as APIC, has been in the large commercial transport APU business since the delivery of the first APS2000 APU in 1989. However, HSPS has a much longer history in the gas turbine design business, delivering APUs to the U.S. military since 1959.

What happened to Hamilton Sundstrand?

On 2 January 2008, Hamilton Sundstrand said it would commercialize the concentrated solar power tower technology and corresponding molten salt storage system developed by Rocketdyne through a new entity known as SolarReserve. In 2012, Hamilton Sundstrand was merged with Goodrich Corporation to form UTC Aerospace Systems.

What does Hamilton Sundstrand do for the ISS?

"Our people have worked extremely hard to meet and exceed all of the mission's requirements." Hamilton Sundstrand, a partner in America's space program since its inception, provides a number of other systems for the ISS, including those that control electrical power and process water, waste and air.

Where is Hamilton Sundstrand headquartered?

Hamilton Sundstrand employs approximately 16,700 people worldwide and is headquartered in Windsor Locks, Conn. In addition to its space business, Hamilton Sundstrand is among the world's largest suppliers of technologically advanced aerospace and industrial products.

Who owns Hamilton Sundstrand?

The industrial division of Hamilton Sundstrand was sold by United Technologies in July 2012 to The Carlyle Group and BC Partners. In 2013, The four industrial companies became subsidiaries of new parent company Accudyne Industries, Inc.

Who is Hamilton Sundstrand?

Hamilton Sundstrand was an American globally active corporation that manufactured and supported aerospace and industrial products for worldwide markets. A subsidiary of United Technologies Corporation, it was headquartered in Windsor Locks, Connecticut. The company was formed from the merger of Hamilton Standard and Sundstrand Corporation in 1999.
