

Should livestock feed be stored in a bag after opening?

It is best to never store livestock feed in the bag after opening - especially if you live in a hot climate, or during the summer months. Typically, a safe level of moisture for livestock feed is a relative humidity of 75%. When storing livestock feed during the summer months or in a tropical environment expect it to have a shorter shelf life.

How long does heat treated feed last?

Heat treated feeds like pelleted grains or by-products will have increased storage value as the heating process will kill some of the bacteria. Expect at least 3 months and up to 6 months storage from any heat treated pellet.
