

How much urine can an adult diaper hold?

How much fluid can a diaper hold?

Some Adult diapers are designed for light incontinence and can hold around 8 to 10 ounces of fluid, while others for heavy or overnight incontinence can hold up to 20 to 30 ounces or more.
