The Northern lights forecast for 21:00-00:00 Arrival of the Aurora locally is estimated at 23:30, with some visibility likely before if the Aurora is 'active' or 'very active'. Sufficient darkness tonight will be from 19:04. The current Aurora is a Kp1-2 (on a scale of 0-9) and will cover all of Iceland from 23:30.

Even without aurora-generating CMEs or coronal holes, northern lights regularly appear over high-latitude locations such as Iceland thanks to the solar wind continuously buffeting Earth's magnetic field. Of course, seeing the northern lights also depends on having good weather when we're in Iceland.

Since the sun controls how and when the Northern Lights show up here on Earth, 2024-2026 is going to be the best time in a decade to see them. The best months to see the lights are from September to April. So, the six months from now to April 2025, and September 2025 to April 2026, are likely the best times to go hunting the Northern Lights.

Planning a visit to Iceland for the Northern Lights involves timing your trip to align with the optimal conditions for aurora viewing. Generally, the best months to witness the Northern Lights in Iceland are from

late August to early April. This period offers the advantage of longer nights, which are essential for observing the auroras.

This southern location, away from the city lights, is another excellent spot for seeing the Northern Lights in Iceland. Day 4 - Jökull Glacier Lagoon and Glacier Hiking.
