

Are data centers consuming too much energy in Ireland?

Ireland embraced data centers that the AI boom needs. Now they're consuming too much of its energy. CLONDALKIN, Ireland (AP) -- Dozens of massive data centers humming at the outskirts of Dublin are consuming more electricity than all of the urban homes in Ireland and starting to wear out the warm welcome that brought them here.

Are Irish people reluctant to change their energy behaviour?

Today, a significant part of the Irish populace remains reluctant to change their energy behaviours as revealed in our recent "Powering tomorrow" report. For example, only 1 in 5 express an interest in switching to an electric vehicle over the next 5 years with 50% naming price as the main barrier.

How will the 2024 energy year impact Ireland?

This could have several implications for the 2024 energy year in Ireland. Opportunities for renewables growth will need to be consolidated with issues like mandates for energy efficiency and accommodating for large energy users. We need to ensure that short-term challenges do not restrict opportunities for long-term growth.

How did energy demand change in Ireland in 2023?

Ireland's total energy demand increased by 0.8% in 2023, led mainly by increased energy demand for transport (up 4.5%) and from the commercial services sector (up 6.9%), which includes data centre demand. Increased demand for transport energy came mainly from private car use and aviation, which accounted for 40% and 22% respectively.

Does Ireland still have a peat-fired power plant?

Will Ireland's Transport and electricity emissions exceed the first carbon budget?

It is also likely that Ireland's transport and electricity emissions will exceed their sectoral emission ceiling in the first carbon budget (2021-2025). Any emissions that exceed the first carbon budget are carried over into the second carbon budget, where they will need to be addressed by even more intensive policies and measures.

Ireland's national energy-related emissions in 2023 were at their lowest level in over 30 years. Energy-related emissions in 2023 were 31.4 MtCO₂ eq, down 8.3% on 2022 levels, and lower even than those observed

during the height of COVID impacts in 2020. Energy-related emissions fell by over 2.8 MtCO₂ eq in 2023 - the largest annual reduction observed in 12 years.
