How much energy does Japan use?

Japan consumed 17.03 EJ, 3% of the world's consumption and 7% of Asia-Pacific's consumption (3rd largest behind China and India). Nuclear energy's contribution to electricity generation has fluctuated, dropping to zero in 2014, then climbing to 6.5% by 2019.

How did Fukushima affect Japan's energy supply?

The Fukushima accident also led to a 16% reduction in total primary energy supply (TPES) from 2010 to 2019. Japan's rapid industrial growth since the end of World War II doubled the nation's energy consumption every five years into the 1990s.

What is Japan's feed-in tariff scheme?

One initiative the Japanese government has implemented in order to boost the amount of renewable energy produced and purchased in Japan is the feed-in tariff scheme. The scheme encourages companies to invest in renewable energy by providing set prices for various types of renewable energy.
