

Why is Kuwait launching a solar PV project?

Kuwait Authority for Partnership Projects initiates a tender for the Al Dibdibah Power and Al Shagaya Renewable Energy - Phase III - Zone 1 Solar PV project, aiming for a 1,100 MW capacity. The move accelerates Kuwait's transition to sustainable energy, inviting companies to participate and contribute to the country's renewable energy objectives.

How much solar energy does Kuwait use a day?

Kuwait's average solar intake is about 9-11 hours per day with an average daily solar insolation that can reach more than 7.0 kWh/m²/day. This potential solar energy technology can be applied for a capacity credit/factor in power generation, a potential economic returns, and environmental benefits for the country.

How much PV capacity does Kuwait have in 2023?

According to the International Renewable Energy Agency, Kuwait had approximately 43 MW of installed PV capacity and 50 MW of CSP capacity by the end of 2023. Will Kaap build a 1100 MW solar project in Al-shaqaya?

The Kuwait Authority for Partnership Projects (KAPP) has launched a tender to build a 1,100 MW solar project in Al-Shaqaya, Al-Jahra Governorate, near Kuwait City. The KAAP said that project developers will have to hold at least a 15% stake in the submitted projects.

How to get RFQ package in Kuwait?

RFQ Package: Interested parties can obtain the Request for Qualification (RFQ) package by making a payment of 3,500 Kuwaiti Dinars. The deadline for purchasing the RFQ package is 22nd Feb 2024. **Submission Deadline:** Applicants must upload all required elements onto the electronic portal by noon on 7th March 2024.
