Does St. Kitts already have a solar PV system?

St. Kitts will receive 30 - 35% of its annual electricity demand from a solar PV system as part of a new project. The solar and storage system will supply sustainable solar energy with zero emissions and replace over 4,000,000 gallons of diesel per year. The energy will be provided under a fixed-price PPA for a period of 25 years.

What does PPA stand for in St Kitts & Nevis?

The Government of St. Kitts and Nevis, along with SKELEC, the state-owned St. Kitts Electricity Company Ltd, have executed an amended Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) with SOLEC Power Ltd, a subsidiary JV of Leclanché, for the solar photovoltaic and battery storage project located in Basseterre.

When will SKELEC start supplying Solar energy to St Kitts?

The project is scheduled to start construction in the second quarter of 2024 and start providing the solar energy to SKELEC in 2025. With the execution of the amended 25-year PPA and other related documents, the project is putting St. Kitts at the leading edge of renewable energy integration worldwide.
