

What is a busbar trunking system?

Can a busbar trunking system be 100 % loaded?

This means that the busbar trunking system can be 100 % loaded. When you decide on your short-circuit protection using fuses and circuit breakers you must not exceed the specified short-circuit strength of the busbar trunking systems.

How can a busbar trunking system save money?

In an electrical installation, one area where savings can be made and provide the features listed above is in the use of busbar trunking systems. Busbar trunking installations can be categorised into two basic types: Distribution and Feeder. This is the most common use of busbar trunking and is applied to distribute power over a predetermined area.

How is power taken from busbar trunking?

Power is taken from busbar trunking by the use of tap off units which connect at defined positions along the busbar trunking, and allow power to be taken from the system, usually via a suitable overcurrent protective device.

How can a busbar trunking system be protected against short-circuit?

A system can be protected against short-circuit alone by fitting low-voltage LV HRC fuses (gG) into the incoming supply; the fuse size to be appropriate for the prospective short-circuit current at the place of installation. Busbar trunking systems must be protected against overload and short circuits.

What is a LI busbar trunking system?

The LI busbar trunking system is the perfect equipment for multi-floor buildings where large quantities of power need to be transported, uninfluenced by the mounting position of the system. The encapsulated LR system (up to 6300 A) is extremely resistant to external interference thanks to its high degree of protection.
