Metal hydrides (MH) are known as one of the most suitable material groups for hydrogen energy storage because of their large hydrogen storage capacity, low operating pressure, and high safety. However, their slow hydrogen absorption kinetics significantly decreases storage performance.

Magnesium hydride (MgH_2) offers a wide range of potential applications as an energy carrier due to its advantages of low cost, abundant supplies, and high energy storage capacity.

Are magnesium-based hydrogen storage alloys a good choice for metal hydrides?

Among the various metal hydrides, magnesium-based hydrogen storage alloys have attracted significant attention due to their high hydrogen storage capacity (up to 7.6 wt.% for MgH_2), abundant reserves, low cost, and good reversibility [11, 12].

Are magnesium-based hydrides a practical storage solution?
