Legal Framework Mauritius has a hybrid legal system which combines both civil and common law practices. It is governed by principles drawn from both the French Napoleonic Code and English Common Law. Is Mauritius a good country?

Mauritius also ranked 1st on the 2020 Mo Ibrahim Index of African Governance and has an attractive fiscal regime with a corporate tax rate of 15%. Companies qualifying as residents for tax purposes are entitled to a "partial exemption" regime of 80% on specified foreign source income.
