

How to maintain CalMac ice bank tanks & thermal energy storage system?

Maintenance of CALMAC Ice Bank tanks and the thermal energy storage system is not much different from conventional cooling. Perform chiller maintenance as required, check the health of the glycol fluid annually, check the water level in the tanks, and add biocide every other year to eliminate algae growth.

How long does it take to charge an ice bank tank?

A full charging cycle of an Ice Bank tank takes about 6 to 12 hours, depending upon the job criteria. During the peak-load discharge cycle the following day (see Discharge Cycle), the glycol solution leaving the chiller is 52°F, where chiller operation is more efficient than a conventional chiller systems' requirement of 44°F.

What cooling mediums can I use with my ice bank?

Almost all cooling or heating mediums can be used with our Ice Banks, such as R717, CO<sub>2</sub>, Propylene Glycol, Ethylene Glycol, and Freon refrigerants. If you need more information about other cooling mediums, please email one of our engineers.

Is ice bank a good investment?

Experience has shown that return on investment for Ice banks is less than 4 years, so it is considered a valuable investment. Apart from air conditioning, Ice Bank is also used in industry, where the demand for cooling is often variable. For example, in dairy production, milk is brought to the collection in the morning.

How does an ice bank heat exchanger work?

The water-glycol solution that is leaving the chiller and arriving at the tank is 25°F, which freezes the water surrounding the heat exchanger inside the tank. This process extracts the heat from the water surrounding the Ice Bank heat exchanger until approximately 95 percent of the water inside the tank has been frozen solid.

Storage or building ice: Evaporator panels are placed upright in a rectangular water tank. Ice is built at an evaporation temperature between -4 and -10 °C, depending on the storage time. The ice sticks to the evaporator panels (static ice bank). For ammonia systems, a separate suction pipe at the evaporator ensures the oil return.

An ice bank storage technology for cooling purposes is known for a long time. The main drawbacks which are hindering its wider use are the system complexity, high first costs, system efficiency which is highly dependant on design, control and monitoring of the system, etc. On the other hand, ice slurry technology was not well studied until ...

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If a condition is reached where the ice storage tanks can no longer supply the cooling load, one of the chillers would be operated, perhaps at partial capacity, to supplement the output of the ice storage tanks. The modulating 3-way valve would determine the proportions of flow through the ice bank versus straight through the valve.

Storage mode or ice buildup: In the static ice storage, the evaporator plates are in an open tank filled with water, i. A. in a rectangular tank. Ice freezes, depending on the storage time at an evaporation temperature of -4 to -10 &#176; C on the vertical plates to a homogeneous layer of up to 55 mm, which firmly adheres to the plates.
