

Which negative electrode material has the best storage performance?

Among the available negative electrode materials, hard carbon shows the best overall storage performance in terms of high storage capacity and good cycling.

What is a zero-strain negative electrode material for sodium-ion batteries?

Here we report a zero-strain negative electrode material for sodium-ion batteries, the P2-type layered Na<sub>0.66</sub>[Li<sub>0.22</sub>Ti<sub>0.78</sub>]O<sub>2</sub>, which exhibits an average storage voltage of 0.75 V and a reversible capacity of 116 mAh g<sup>-1</sup>.

What is the specific capacity of a negative electrode material?

As the negative electrode material of SIBs, the material has a long period of stability and a specific capacity of 673 mAh g<sup>-1</sup> when the current density is 100 mAh g<sup>-1</sup>.
