

Will Uzbekistan fund a 250-megawatt solar photovoltaic plant?

TASHKENT, May 21, 2024 -- The World Bank Group, Abu Dhabi Future Energy Company PJSC (Masdar), and the Government of Uzbekistan have signed a financial package to fund a 250-megawatt (MW) solar photovoltaic plant with a 63-MW battery energy storage system (BESS).

Will the World Bank support a solar photovoltaic plant in Uzbekistan?

The World Bank on Tuesday (May 21) announced that it will support a 250-megawatt (MW) solar photovoltaic plant with a 63-MW battery energy storage system (BESS) in Uzbekistan -- Central Asia's first renewable energy facility with a utility-scale battery storage component.

Will Uzbekistan have a solar power grid?

For instance, the UAE's state-owned Masdar added 511MW of photovoltaic projects to Uzbekistan's grid in March and, in January, expanded its partnership with the Uzbek government to develop 500MWh of battery storage and 2GW of wind energy. Uzbekistan aims for 12GW of renewable capacity by 2030, with 7GW from solar PV.

How does the World Bank support Uzbekistan?

Additionally, the World Bank continues to provide support to create an enabling environment for private renewable energy deployment and broader sector reforms in Uzbekistan. To implement these solar power plants, Masdar will invest \$193 million of equity in the Project Companies.

Why should Uzbekistan integrate BESS into the grid?

By incorporating BESS into the grid, Uzbekistan will soon have the largest battery energy storage facilities in the region which will play a crucial role in stabilising the grid while promoting renewable energy in the Republic. The BESS will help to mitigate the effects of intermittency that are inherent in renewable energy sources.

Why is ACWA Power partnering with Uzbekistan?

It will help to reach Uzbekistan's target of using 25% renewable sources for electricity generation by 2030. At the same time, it will improve quality of life for people in Uzbekistan by reducing carbon emissions and air pollution." The loan is to fund three separate projects, all fully owned by Masdar (Abu Dhabi Future Energy Company PJSC).

In July 2021, Masdar signed an agreement with the Ministry of Investment and Foreign Trade of the Republic of Uzbekistan and JSC National Electric Grid of Uzbekistan to design, finance, build and operate a 220 megawatt (MW) utility-scale solar PV project in the Samarkand Region.
