

Do I need a power plug travel adapter in Palau?

In Palau, power plugs and sockets (outlets) of type A and type B are used. The standard voltage is 120 V at a frequency of 60 Hz. Yes, you need a power plug travel adapter for sockets type A and B in Palau. You also need a voltage converter. Be extra careful with certain devices because of the difference in frequency.
