How is Svalbard governed?

The first thing to understand is how Svalbard is governed. The islands are part of Norway but are covered by the Svalbard Treaty, which gives equal rights to engage in commercial activities to the 46 signatories. The Norwegian Government appoints a Governor who also acts as Chief of Police.
