

What is the future of energy storage?

Storage enables electricity systems to remain in balance despite variations in wind and solar availability, allowing for cost-effective deep decarbonization while maintaining reliability. The Future of Energy Storage report is an essential analysis of this key component in decarbonizing our energy infrastructure and combating climate change.

Can long-duration energy storage technologies solve the intermittency problem?

Long-duration energy storage technologies can be a solution to the intermittency problem of wind and solar power but estimating technology costs remains a challenge. New research identifies cost targets for long-duration storage technologies to make them competitive against different firm low-carbon generation technologies.

What drives the cost-effectiveness of long-duration storage technologies?

Moreover, the researchers conclude that energy storage capacity cost and discharge efficiency are the most critical drivers for the cost-effectiveness of long-duration storage technologies -- for example, energy capacity cost becomes the largest cost driver as discharge duration increases.

Can long-duration storage help decarbonize the electricity system?

The Department of Energy has identified the need for long-duration storage as an essential part of fully decarbonizing the electricity system, and, in 2021, set a goal that research, development and investment would help to reduce the costs of the technologies by 90 percent in a decade.

What is a long-duration energy storage system?

Toronto-based Hydrostor Inc. is one of the businesses developing long-duration energy storage that has moved beyond lab scale and is now focusing on building big things. The company makes systems that store energy underground in the form of compressed air, which can be released to produce electricity for eight hours or longer.

What are the different types of energy storage technologies?

Long duration energy storage technologies can include mechanical (for example, pumped hydro and compressed air energy storage), electrochemical (for example, sodium-sulfur batteries and vanadium redox flow batteries), chemical (for example, hydrogen and ammonia storage), and thermal (for example, molten salts and salt hydrates) approaches.
