Wallis and Futuna, officially the Territory of the Wallis and Futuna Islands[A][3] (/ 'wʔl?s ... fu:'tu:n? /), is a French island collectivity in the South Pacific, situated between Tuvalu to the northwest, Fiji to the southwest, Tonga to the southeast, Samoa to the east, and Tokelau to the northeast. Mata Utu is its capital and largest city.

The territory is divided into threetraditional kingdoms (royaumes coutumiers): Uvea,on the island of Wallis,Sigave,on the western part of the island of Futuna,and Alo,on the eastern part of the island of Futuna and on the uninhabited island of Alofi (only Uvea is further subdivided,into three districts):

Why is Futuna called Hoornse Eylanden?

Futuna was first put on European maps by Willem Schouten and Jacob Le Maire,during their circumnavigation of the globe,in 1616. They named the islands of Futuna "Hoornse Eylanden",after the Dutch town of Hoorn where they hailed from. This was later translated into French,as "Isles de Horne."
