

Where is Pitcairn located?

It comprises the islands of Pitcairn,Henderson,Ducie and Oeno. Pitcairn,the only inhabited island,is a small volcanic outcrop situated in the South Pacificat latitude 25.04 south and longitude 130.06 west. It is roughly 2170km (1350 miles) east south-east of Tahiti and just over 6600km (4100 miles) from Panama.

How many islands are in the Pitcairn Islands?

The Pitcairn Islands form the southeasternmost extension of the geological archipelago of the Tuamotus of French Polynesia,and consist of four islands: Pitcairn Island,Oeno Island (atoll with five islets,one of which is Sandy Island),Henderson Island and Ducie Island (atoll with four islets).

Where are the inhabited islands near the Pitcairn Islands?

Henderson Island accounts for 86% of the land area, but only Pitcairn Island is inhabited. The inhabited islands nearest to the Pitcairn Islands are Mangareva (of French Polynesia), 688 km to the west, [note 2] as well as Easter Island, 1,929 km to the east.

Is Pitcairn Island a volcanic island?

Pitcairn Island is the only inhabited island of the Pitcairn Islands,in the southern Pacific Ocean,of which many inhabitants are descendants of mutineers of HMS Bounty. The island is of volcanic origin,with a rugged cliff coastline. Unlike many other South Pacific islands,it is not surrounded by coral reefs that protect the coast.

Where is the Pitcairn hotspot located?

The Pitcairn hotspot is located at 25°10'S,129°20'W,southeast of Pitcairn Island. Seabed dredging surveys conducted in 1989 revealed trace elements of many commercially important deep-sea minerals in this region (Woodhead &Devey,1993).

Are there Adventist churches in Pitcairn?

Discovery of Pitcairn Island . Captain Philip Carteret first spotted Pitcairn Island in 1767 but couldn't land due to rough seas. He miscalculated its location, marking it miles away from its true position. Years later, Captain Cook showed some interest, but it wasn't until the Bounty mutineers arrived in 1790 that the island gained attention.
