What type of power plugs are used in the Dominican Republic?

In the Dominican Republic, power plugs and sockets (outlets) of type A and type B are used. The standard voltage is 110 V at a frequency of 60 Hz. Does the Dominican Republic need a power adapter?

Most electronic devices from North America and other countries using the same voltage and plug types will work in the Dominican Republic without needing any adapters. If you are bringing electronic devices that use different plug types or require a different voltage, you will need to purchase a travel adapter or voltage converter.

What type of power socket is used in the Dominican Republic?

The power sockets in the Dominican Republic are of type A and B. The standard voltage is 110 V at a frequency of 60 Hz. Check your need for a power plug (travel) adapter in the Dominican Republic.

Do I need a voltage converter in the Dominican Republic?

The Dominican Republic uses 110 volts, the same as the United States. You will not need a voltage converter. However, the Dominican Republic uses different plug types, so you will need a travel adapter to plug your devices into the outlets.
