

Does Paraguay need to expand its power system?

Also, we estimated the annual revenues for the government of Paraguay and Itaipu through its electricity exports to Brazil. What type of power plug is used in Paraguay?

In Paraguay, power plugs and sockets (outlets) of type C are used. The standard voltage is 220 V at a frequency of 50 Hz. For more information, select the country you live in at the top of this page. What type of power socket is used in Paraguay?

The power sockets in Paraguay are of type C. The standard voltage is 220 V at a frequency of 50 Hz. Check your need for a power plug (travel) adapter in Paraguay.

What is the electricity system of Paraguay?

The electricity system of Paraguay is mainly powered by two binational (Itaipu, Yacyretá) and one national (Rio Acaray) hydropower plant. The Parana River, located in the Southeastern area of the country, is responsible for most of this hydroelectric generation potential.

Who controls the electricity market in Paraguay?

The National Electricity Administration (Administración Nacional de Electricidad, ANDE), Paraguay's state-owned utility, controls the country's entire electricity market, including generation, transmission and distribution.

Do I need a power plug adapter when travelling to Paraguay?

Select the country you are from to see if you need a power plug adapter when travelling to Paraguay. Paraguay uses power outlets and plugs of type C. Take a look at the picture below to see what this plug and power socket looks like: Do the outlets look different in your country? You'll need a power plug adapter.
