You might wonder why the United States and Europe use different electric power standards. While the North American electric grid system delivers AC powered at 110-120V with a frequency of 60 Hz, European nations use AC powered at 220-240V with a frequency of 50 Hz. Europe started out mirroring the original US standard at 110V/60 Hz.
