Who owns electricity in Qatar?

Qatar has two major players in the electrical and water utility sector: Kahramaa and QEWC. The Qatar General Electricity and Water Corporation, also known as Kahramaa, controls electricity distribution and transmission throughout the country and serves as the sole purchaser of electricity in Qatar.
