

What is a 1 GW solar power project in Serbia?

1 GW Solar Power Project in Serbia, set to transform the country's renewable energy landscape and boost sustainability efforts.

How many solar plants are there in Serbia?

Serbia will soon see six large solar plants strategically positioned across the country. Key locations include Negotin, Zaječar, and Bošnjace. Together, these sites will provide 1 GW of solar energy capacity. Each plant will also have advanced battery storage systems totaling 200 MW, ensuring stable electricity flow across the national grid.

Does Serbia have a solar project?

The contract is the latest in a line of solar projects backed by Serbia's Ministry of Mining and Energy this year, which includes plans for a 1 GW solar panel factory and another 500 MW of solar. Figures from the International Renewable Energy Agency state Serbia had deployed a total 137 MW of solar by the end of last year.

Where will solar power be installed in Serbia?

The Ministry of Mining and Energy and EPS (Elektroprivreda Srbije) partnered with Hyundai Engineering and UGT Renewables to drive this project. Serbia will soon see six large solar plants strategically positioned across the country. Key locations include Negotin, Zaječar, and Bošnjace.

How many MW of battery storage will be developed in Serbia?

Up to 200 MW of battery storage will be developed across the sites. Image: Ministry of Mining and Energy, Tanjug Plans for 1 GW of new solar in Serbia are set to go ahead after the signing of an implementation agreement.

How much electricity does Serbia get from fossil fuels?

Serbia currently gets more than 60% of its electricity from fossil fuels. The contract is the latest in a line of solar projects backed by Serbia's Ministry of Mining and Energy this year, which includes plans for a 1 GW solar panel factory and another 500 MW of solar.

Two units have connection approval for 9.999 MW each from electricity distribution operator Elektrodistribucija Srbije (EDS). There is no standalone solar power unit yet on the country's transmission network. The two PV facilities span 15 hectares each on a 116-hectare plot, planned for the solar park's expansion.

The project for the photovoltaic power plant envisages the construction of 100 MW solar park at the ash landfill of thermal power plants Kostolac A and Kostolac B and the project is currently under consideration.

The landfill has an area of 270 hectares, while production of solar power plants would total to 97.2 million kWh per year.

According to representatives from EPS, the Kostolac coal basin has the potential to support over 1,000 MW of solar power plants on its mined-out areas, closed landfills and former ash dumps. Jovan Tomic, Project Manager for the Petka solar power plant, stated that once this capacity is installed, it could generate more than 1,300 GWh of electricity annually.

Serbia's national power utility Electric Power of Serbia (EPS) produces nearly 70 percent of the country's electricity from coal and nearly 27% percent from hydropower, with approximately 4% coming from private developers in wind and solar energy.
