Wyoming has 47 billion tons of mineable soda ash in the Green River basin. There would be hundreds of TWH of power storage from each billion tons of soda ash. Based on material costs of \$4 per kWh there could be \$8 to \$10 per kWh sodium ion batteries in the future. This would be ten times cheaper than energy storage batteries today.

Does China produce soda ash?

With minimal natural reserves of soda ash and a reluctance to rely on imports from the United States, China instead produces synthetic soda ash at chemical plants fueled by coal. China's synthetic soda ash industry has a record of hazardous water pollution.

Are sodium ion batteries the future of energy storage?

There is also rapidly growing demand for behind-the-meter (at home or work) energy storage systems. Sodium-ion batteries (NIBs) are attractive prospects for stationary storage applications where lifetime operational cost, not weight or volume, is the overriding factor.

Is there a shortage of soda ash?

There is no shortage of salt or soda ash. The United States has about 90% of the world's readily mined reserves of soda ash. Wyoming has 47 billion tons of mineable soda ash in the Green River basin. There would be hundreds of TWH of power storage from each billion tons of soda ash.
