

Who owns a power station in Croatia?

All power stations in Croatia are owned and operated by Hrvatska elektroprivreda (HEP), the national power company. As of 2015, HEP operates 26 hydroelectric, 4 thermal and 3 cogenerating power plants with the total installed electrical power of 3.654 MW.

How many MW is a power plant in Croatia?

The public call for granting approvals was launched by the Ministry of Economy and Sustainable Development, and the total capacity of all power plants is 6,000 MW. The ministry also announced that Croatia's first auction for granting premiums for large renewable power plants would be held.

How can Croatia benefit from solar energy?

However, to harness this potential effectively, Croatia will need to adopt more ambitious solar energy targets, ensure clear renewable energy investment direction in the power sector, and develop its modern electricity grid. The clean energy transition and development of the solar power sector can contribute to GDP growth and new jobs creation.

Is solar irradiation a viable energy source in Croatia?

The abundance of solar irradiation in Croatia shall enable photovoltaic energy to become an increasingly cost-competitive power generation source and attract new investments. Croatian solar resource potential Energy Institute Hrvoje Pozar initiated several solar radiation measurements projects in Croatia.

How much solar power does Croatia have?

By the end of 2014, the country had approximately 33 MW solar capacity. However, solar photovoltaic market growth in Croatia between 2015 and 2019 was moderate, with only 20.4 MW newly installed capacity in this period from eligible producers. Will El Sun energy get energy approvals in Croatia?

El Sun Energy's photovoltaic project is one of 216 on the list of potential investors interested in obtaining energy approvals in Croatia. The public call for granting approvals was launched by the Ministry of Economy and Sustainable Development, and the total capacity of all power plants is 6,000 MW.

The location is next to its only wind park, also called Korlat, near Benkovac in Dalmatia. The integration of the two power stations would create the country's first hybrid power plant. Sixty renewable energy projects are in pipeline. HEP is developing projects for 11 solar power plants and another wind farm.
