

What is Papua New Guinea's rooftop solar project?

Project Info: PNG Power Rooftop Solar Project by PNG Power and IFC **Project Details IFC**, a member of the World Bank Group, and PNG Power Limited have begun consultations with business on expanding renewable energy sources in Papua New Guinea with a proposal for a pilot rooftop solar program in the capital, Port Moresby.

How many solar homes have been installed in Papua New Guinea?

To date, more than 25,000 solar home and community systems have been installed, alongside hundreds of solar streetlights across Papua New Guinea. Access to clean and reliable energy has been transformative, improving livelihoods, healthcare, and safety, especially for women and girls.

What is the Papua New Guinea project?

The project aims to improve electricity services to customers in remote areas and make PPL's services more sustainable. The people of Papua New Guinea stand to benefit from more reliable power and fewer carbon emissions under a project that aims to boost investment in renewable energy and improve electricity services in remote areas of the country.

How many people in PNG have electricity?

Currently only 20% of residents in PNG are connected to electricity with the government's being 70% of the population by 2030, which was bolstered late last year during the signing of an agreement to establish the 5 MW East New Britain solar farm and storage project on 10 hectares at Wairiki.

Will Aitape & Arawa solar farms provide electricity in 2024?

The Aitape (West Sepik) and Arawa solar farms will provide electricity to more than 50,000 households and both leaders expressed looking forward to continuing a pipeline of solar farms and household solar projects in 2024, including in Central, Madang and West New Britain Provinces.

Does PNG have electricity?

Despite PNG being a resource-rich nation with abundant sources of energy, access to power is very limited. It's estimated only 13 percent of people have access to on-grid electricity, mainly in urban areas. In remote areas, access is unreliable, blackouts are frequent, and costs are high.
