How much solar energy does the Sahara Desert have?

The sheer scale of the Sahara's solar potential is staggering. NASA estimates that each square meter of the desert receives between 2,000 and 3,000 kilowatt-hours of solar energy annually. To put this into perspective, a solar farm covering just one square kilometer could generate 5 to 7 GWh of energy daily.

How is Saharan solar power transforming Europe?

How does DESERTEC work?

Desertec initially focused on concentrated solar power (CSP) technology for energy generation. Unlike the more familiar photovoltaic (PV) panels, CSP uses mirrors to concentrate sunlight, generating heat to drive steam turbines. This approach allows for energy storage, potentially providing more consistent power output.
