

Will the US help Ukraine withstand Russian strikes on energy infrastructure?

Meanwhile, the EU and U.S. recently earmarked a combined \$112 million in energy equipment and building for DTEK, the private Ukrainian power company. The aid is supposed to help Ukraine continue to weather Russian strikes on energy infrastructure, the most recent of which was on Nov. 17.

Could Russia strike a Ukrainian thermal power plant again?

A section of a thermal power plant in Ukraine destroyed after a Russian rocket strike. Ukrainian private energy supplier DTEK says Russia has struck the plant multiple times since the 2022 invasion. Workers put in extra shifts to repair the plant's critical infrastructure, knowing that Russia could strike the plant again.

What's happening at a Ukrainian power plant after Russian strikes?

The staff at a Ukrainian power station are busy repairing parts of the plant damaged by Russian strikes. There are teams on cranes, and crews on the muddy ground. Across Ukraine, workers continue the seemingly Sisyphean task of repairing power plants after each Russian attack.

How has Russia impacted Ukraine's energy grid?

Much of the company's infrastructure has been damaged or destroyed. Russian strikes on Ukraine's energy grid have been so frequent this year that they have knocked out more than half of Ukraine's energy-generating capacity.

Why did Ukraine lose 9 GW of power in 2024?

In the wave of attacks between March and May 2024, Ukraine lost another 9 GW of generation capacity; this was mainly thermal and hydro assets, although some smaller solar PV units also came under attack, as well as numerous substations.

How important is interconnection to Ukraine's electricity security?

Interconnection with the main European system has made a crucial contribution to Ukraine's electricity security, with the limit on cross-border trade increasing to 1.7 GW in November 2023. Before the 2022 invasion, Ukraine's power system was interconnected with the Russian and Belarussian grids.
